Behavioral Crisis Response

The City's Behavioral Crisis Response teams are now operating 24 hours a day, Monday through Friday. The mobile units have 2 behavioral health responders and outreach supplies, such as water, snacks, and toiletries. 911 dispatchers gather information from the caller to determine if the incident is eligible for a Behavioral Crisis Response team response. MPD can also request assistance from these teams. BCR teams do not respond to incidents involving firearms or violent behavior.
